Uniform Guidance Updates

- In effect October 1, 2024
- Raises the threshold for single audit to \$1 million in federal funding
- Raises the de minimus to 15%
- Raises the equipment threshold to \$10,000
- Department will provide guidance



Housekeeping

- Remember to keep your SAM.gov registration active
 - Prevent being unable to apply and drawdown funds
- Maintain greater than 50% parents on the organization's board
- Second obligations for supplement amounts
- Avoid excessive carryovers and no-cost extensions
- Look for revised guidance on completing annual reports
- Thank you all for your hard work towards meeting and often significantly exceeding project measures




RPTACs' Responsibilities




